25 Items to Discuss.

25.1 Devon Air Ambulance Night Landing Site. The clerk reported that he had spoken to Mr Headdon and confirmed that the sum of £550 had been received from DCC to fund the purchase of materials for the work to be undertaken. Mr Headdon was therefore going to arrange for the digger which had been offered foc by a local contractor.

25.2 Fly Tipping at Common Moor Cross. In his absence, Cllr Thomas had sent the following written report :

I can confirm that I provided Natural England with the details that they required to consider our proposal for the lay-by. They wrote back last week expressing some concerns. These are mainly around what species we intend to use. My feeling is that these can probably be addressed and David Williams and I will be meeting with them on 4th October. Clearly, any work we wanted to do in connection with the Queen's Jubilee is going to be challenging to do this year.

25.3 Parish Council Notice Boards. Cllr Carter confirmed that he had spoken to a local contractor and has obtained a verbal estimate for the replacement of the notice board at Colscott in Devon Oak and the refurbishment of the noticeboard at Putford Bridge. This would include the Queen's Jubilee logo on both boards and the cost would be in the region of £1500. District Councillor Pennington has offered to contribute £350.00 from the councillor grant scheme. It was agreed to proceed with the work and for the clerk to raise a request for a further £350 from Devon County Council via Cllr Morrish.

Proposed by Cllr Wooldridge, seconded by Cllr N Hancock and carried unanimously.

25.4 TDC Community Projects. The clerk confirmed that since the last meeting TDC had advised that they were unable to support funding for the skittles alley as the skittles team do not own the premises. The funding of Common Moor lay by was also outside the remit of the scheme so funds would be awarded to the football team.

25.5 Shooting on Common Moor - Cllr Mrs Drake advised that on 6th June she had heard 2 gunshots on Common Moor and since that time had not seen two juvenile buzzards that had been seen regularly over the Moor. This had been reported to both RSPB and Devon Wildlife Trust but neither organisations were able to assist without further evidence. Cllr Drake had also written to Barnstaple Police but had not received a response. Cllr Drake wished to place signage on the moor prohibiting the use of firearms but as the council do not own the land the council were unsure whether they had the legal right to do this. It was agreed that the Parish Clerk would contact Bradworthy PC to check the position regarding Bradworthy Moor which does have signage and Cllr Carter would raise with the Devon & Cornwall Police Liaison Officer when he receives copy correspondence from Cllr Mrs Drake/

	28.1 Request for support from Holsworthy Rural	Transport	
The Parish Council had received a letter from Holsworthy Rural Transport inviti members of the council to a meeting on 27th July to discuss future funding of the scheme as the trustees had been advised that they would not be able to receiv further funding from the National Lottery and may as a result cease operation in 2023 unless replacement funding can be found. Cllr Mrs Drake and Cllr Carter be attending the meeting on behalf of the Parish Council.			
	Cllr Mrs Drake felt that this was a vitally important service to our residents who live alone enabling them to go to hospital and other appointments as well as attending days out which was important for mental health. Whilst councillors agreed with this point, concern was expressed regarding how much was being requested and whether this would result in an increase in there precept. Some councillors felt that funds should be provided via the surplus from the Common Moor Stewardship Agreement but it was pointed out that the current agreement was for 10 years and it was not guaranteed to be renewed. There was reluctance therefore to commit to an open ended funding request.
